Children's Outdoor Play Equipment.

Individual property value is directly related to the collective attractiveness of all homes in our neighborhood. Bicycles, soccer nets, basketball goals, skateboard ramps and other such play equipment should be stored away and out of sight when not being played with. This will enhance the attractiveness and value of all our homes.

Cars Being Parked In Common Areas And In Front Of Homes.

Please use your garage or driveway to park your cars. Parking your car on the street presents a potential safety issue for children and walkers with passing cars. Common parking areas are designed for visitors and are not for everyday residential use.

Yard Maintenance And Landscaping.

Curb appeal is extremely important in maintaining property value for all homeowners in our subdivision. Lawns should be neatly moved, shrubbery and mulch beds should be neat, clean and attractive at all times. All homeowners thank you.

Boats And Trailers.

Boats and trailers being stored on any lot, unless screened from view of adjoining lots, streets, and common areas, is strictly prohibited by our Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Hidden Point Subdivision.

Dogs Using Neighbor's Yards And Common Grounds And Barking Dogs.

When dog walking, owners have the responsibility to clean up after their dog if it uses any common areas or a neighbor's yard. Barking dogs create a nuisance for our neighborhood. Nuisances are outlined on page 15, section 5 of our Covenants. Your neighbors thank you for being attentive in these two areas regarding your dog.
